Women's Fund of Hawai'i Spring Grants Deadline March 31

Women's Fund of Hawai'i (WFH) invites grant applications from non-profit organizations with innovative, grassroots programs benefiting women and girls.

Women's Fund of Hawaii is the only foundation in Hawaii with a unique focus on women and girls. Since 2005, we have partnered with 175 community-based organizations to improve the lives of women and girls across the Hawaiian Islands.

Women's Fund of Hawaii issues Requests for Proposals twice a year, in the spring and in the fall, with awards given in June and December. Grant guidelines are available at:

In evaluating applications, WFH engages community partners and key connectors in a variety of fields—social services, arts, philanthropy, education—to determine what areas of need might be underfunded and which problem areas may be emerging under the radar to complement the work of larger non-profits in the community. Women's Fund of Hawaii frequently works with smaller organizations that may be new to organized philanthropy—or these organizations find us—and thus can provide scarce resources where community need is greatest.

Spring Grants Period opens March 1 and closes on March 31 at midnight.

Fall Grants Period opens September 1 and closes on September 30 at midnight.

Existing programs that have previously received WFH grants may apply. Organizations are not expected to create new programs to apply for WFH grants.
