Women's Fund of Hawai'i Announces Limited-Edition Artwork Print by Jana Ireijo to Benefit Women and Girls Across Hawai'i

March 12, Honolulu, Hawai'i — Women's Fund of Hawai'i (WFH) is pleased to announce the release of **limited-edition archival prints of "Facing the Future,"** an original artwork by artist **Jana Ireijo (@VanishingMurals)**. Proceeds from the sale of the print will support programs benefiting women and girls across Hawai'i.

In 2025, Women's Fund of Hawai'i celebrated **20 years as a nonprofit organization** and partnered with Ireijo to create artwork that reflects the organization's vision of progress and possibility. The resulting piece, titled **"Facing the Future,"** represents forward movement, empowerment, and collective strength.

"We loved Jana's previous work with color and how she depicts movement and empowerment," said **Elisabeth Case, Executive Director of Women's Fund of Hawai'i**. "This piece also gives a nod to the activism of the 1960s and '70s women's movement and honors what has been accomplished thus far for women."

The work also reflects the values that guide the Women's Fund of Hawai'i's mission, including:

- **Ho'ohanohano** — the human right to dignity of person, spirit, and choice for every woman and girl
- Partnership in the spirit of **Lōkahi** (unity and harmony) and **Kōkua** (reciprocity)
- Honoring the cultures of each woman and girl — their stories, truth, experience, and gifts
- The right of every woman and girl to be self-determining
- **Hawai'i nei**, the shared home that connects and sustains us all

Ireijo drew inspiration from the natural and cultural values of the islands when creating the piece.

"I wanted to depict the abundance of water, which represents wealth," said Ireijo. "I was inspired by the **ahupua'a** concept, and this woman embodies all that we share according to our island values of aloha and community."

"We are celebrating women as forces of connection and resilience," added Case. "The figure is 'Facing the Future' — moving forward, looking up and outward — which Jana beautifully represents through the moon and stars."



The **limited-edition prints are hand-signed and numbered by the artist** and are available for purchase online now. Proceeds benefit Women's Fund of Hawai'i.
